Description of 3 train movement in Australian made Silky Oak Longcase, the movement fully restored in our workshops, delivered & installed early February 2006, with 12 months warranty.

- The dial of solid brass with spandrels and engraved and filled chapter ring silvered and in good original finish with strike / silent and chime select with 2 tunes, Westminster on gongs & Whittington on 8-bells playing the ¼'s known as a 4/4 chime playing each quarter.
- The movement of very good quality, most likely of heavily constructed English origin C1895.
- The very heavy plate structure approximately 4mm thick, the wheels and all parts of the same structure and quality
- The movement with three weight driven movement trains; going train to the centre, strike train to the left and the musical chime train to the right.
- The three weights of the correct period and style with the heaviest on the right and brass filled seconds beating pendulum with solid rod.
- While restoring movement no recognised name was found as is the case on most of these late Victorian musical large clock movements, but we did find that the wheels were cast and a cast name was found on all three great wheels some clearer than others as shown below which we read as "A. Ingram 5" which we as yet have not found.
